

01 Introduction The **Project Management Institute (PMI)** is the world's leading non-profit professional membership association for the Project, Program and Portfolio Management profession. PMI serves practitioners and organizations with standards that describe good practices, globally recognized credentials that certify project management expertise, and resources for professional development, networking and community.

All PMI chapters hold regular events in different cities and online, and in addition PMI Belgium also usually hold a full-day annual congress, the 'PM Fair', where prominent speakers of national and international reputation are invited to share their experiences and discuss recent developments and future trends in the field of project management. This popular event is typically attended by over 200 PMI members, sponsoring organizations and other enthusiasts of the project management profession.

# CHANGE MANAGEMENT: Adapting our today for a better tomorrow









### **Keynote**



The Keynote seminar should address the main themes of change management as well as setting the high standard for the remainder of the congress.

Holding their audience's attention for up to an hour, speakers should emphasise both the challenges and rewards of change management as well as inspire our community with ideas of the future..

### Classic seminar

Similarly, the classic seminar presentation should hold audience members captive, and explore key aspects of change management, although typically shorter.

## Master Class & Workshop

Workshops are typically opportunities to work individually or in groups to learn a new skill or concept whereas Master Classes tend to be more of an indepth knowledge-sharing or further development of a particular expertise or discipline.

The format of the presentations and the program will be decided once the speakers have been selected.

- 2. Abstracts submitted in alignment to the PM Fair theme and relevance to the profession, feasibility of proposed activity, experience of the speaker will be reviewed and a list of selected presenters for the event will be decided in June.
- 3. Selected presenters will receive confirmation together with specific guidance and a deadline for the submission of their full draft presentation soon after.

06 Presenter selection process





### Items required for submission:

- Presenter's name, telephone number, e-mail address and picture.
- 2. Proposed topic or subject, including how it connects to the PM Fair.
- 3. Give your role preference (Keynote, Classic seminar, Master Class, workshop).
- 4. Timing preference day and timing (will be accommodated as far as possible).
- 5. Presenter's bio/profile (75 -100 words).
- 6. Presentation abstract (100 125 words).
- 7. Learning goals summary i.e.: what do you want the audience to learn from your presentation. (1-3 simple bullet sentences)
- 8. A short outline on presentation experience.
- 9. Any special requirements for your presentation.
- 10. Presenter's willingness to prepare a short video of less than 2 minutes introducing themselves and the topic. This video will be used in the promotional campaign for the congress and may be shared on LinkedIn or other social media. A link to an online video of a given speech on the topic is also allowed.
