As you probably may know, in June 2007, I received the Research Collaboration Funds from PMI Belgium which helped me to fund parts of my research project titled "Measuring the influence of performance measurement techniques on the project control accuracy". Thanks to this initiative and the funds I was able to buy extra computer power to set up a huge and computational extensive computer experiment which allowed me to investigate a large number of project files under various assumptions.

A year later, I was the winner of the prestigious IPMA Research award 2008 at the 22nd World Congress in Rome (Italy) for the research study project "Measuring Time — An Earned Value Simulation Study". Obviously, the PMI Belgium funds can be seen as the trigger for this extensive research project. During the presentation in Rome, I explicitly mentioned the PMI Belgium contribution as the foundation of this research project.

The study has resulted in a book, international peer-reviewed papers (3 academic papers and 1 book chapter) and various papers in the more popular press (mainly in The Measurable News), each time mentioning the Research Collaboration funding of PMI Belgium (see appendix). More papers are in review and will hopefully be accepted in recognized peer-reviewed academic papers.

At the beginning of this year (2010), my book "Measuring Time: Improving Project Performance using Earned Value Management" was finally introduced on the market. With this book, I hope I am able to summarize the work I have done throughout the past years and to stimulate further research efforts in this field.
