




PM Fair 2019 Project Management and Digital Disruption. Are you ready?

Introduction

The **Project Management Institute** (PMI) is the world's leading non-profit professional membership association for the Project, Program and Portfolio Management profession. PMI serves practitioners and organizations with standards that describe good practices, globally recognized credentials that certify project management expertise, and resources for professional development, networking and community.

PMI Belgium Chapter is the local representation of PMI worldwide and has about 1000 members. Besides holding regular events in different cities, PMI Belgium also holds a full-day **annual congress**, where prominent speakers of national and international reputation are invited to share their experiences and recent developments and future trends in the field of project management. This popular event is attended by over 200 PMI members, sponsoring organizations and other enthusiasts of the project management profession. -This year's annual event will be held on **Friday**, **the 4**th **of October 2019** at Hotel Le Plaza in Brussels, Belgium, with a challenging theme that is aimed at inspiring all the participants.

The Theme:

Project Management and Digital Disruption. Are you ready?

Project management professionals that will succeed in this age of disruption will have the right mindset; they will adapt rapidly to the opportunities and challenges brought about by new and rapidly evolving technology, with a powerful impact and global reach.

The 2019 PM Fair challenges our participants, 'Are you ready?' and the aim of the program is to challenge thinking, broaden horizons and put the wheels in motion to create 'Project Managers of the future'.







The Program Content

The main theme will be addressed from three different, but equally important, perspectives, represented by three different tracks throughout the congress. The following outlines the perspective for each track, to provide inspiration for potential speakers in providing their abstract:

• Track 1: Digital Disruption:

Not intended to be a pure technical stream – but instead, a practical review of technological advances from the business and project management perspective

- o Increasing awareness and understanding of emerging technologies e.g. Blockchain, RPA, data analytics
- Determining the realistic potential of these technologies, what is / what is not possible / what is achievable and what timescales
- Disruption impact on organization, products and services, and strategy

• Track 2: The Human in the Digital World

Identifying and developing the soft skills to deal with the digital revolution:

- o The impact of technology on the workplace, changing culture
- o The innovative mindset
- Managing diversity / virtual teams
- Stakeholders guiding them through the digital minefield, from virtual to reality
- Digital competencies, digital awareness, digital learning

• Track 3: Project Management in the New Age:

- New product methodologies for the new environment
- Adapting existing, established processes and methodologies
- o Expectation management
- Data driven decision making

The topics within the tracks are suggestions, guidance. Speakers are welcome to propose ideas for subjects and delivery within or across the tracks, in line with the overall theme.







The Format

The three tracks will be delivered with an appropriate mix of presentations, workshops and master classes.

Presentations

The presentations will take place in 'The Theatre' and will follow the Ted format, with each presentation limited to 18 minutes.

Workshops

Knowledge comes with practice. Speakers with a practical subject, will have the opportunity to facilitate a workshop in a breakout room after their presentation. This will give to participants the opportunity to have a hands-on, interactive experience on the chosen subject.

Call for Speakers

This is a call for thought leaders and innovators to actively participate in the prestigious PMI Belgium Annual National Congress, PM Fair 2019. As presenters, you form a vital part of PM Fair Team and the quality and relevance of the presentations and workshops are crucial for success of the event. Knowing that you are presenting at *THE* Project Management event of Belgium the responsibility is yours to deliver the most fitting and inspirational session, keynote or workshop/special activity.

- 2 Keynote Speakers
- 2 Master Classes
- 4 Workshops
- 9 Classic sessions

There are no fees foreseen for our presenters as you are considered to be part of the PMI family of volunteers supporting the Project Management community of practice. Travel and accommodation expenses could be discussed on a case by case basis.

Each presenter should prepare his or her submission to include the following (see attached form):

- 1. Presenter's name, telephone number, e-mail address and picture.
- 2. Proposed topic or subject, including how it connects to the PM Fair.
- 3. Give your role preference (Classic speaker, Keynote, Master Class, specialist for a booth, etc).
- 4. Presenter's profile (75 -100 words).
- 5. Presentation abstract (100 125 words)
- 6. Learning goals summary i.e.: what do you want the audience to learn from your presentation.
- 7. Presentation experience.
- 8. Any special requirements for your presentation.
- 9. A short video of less than 2 minutes introducing the presenter and the topic. This video will be used in the promotional campaign for the congress. A link to an online video of a given speech on the topic is also allowed.

Presenter Selection Process

The selection process consists of the following steps:

- 1. Submit your request by sending in your abstract and other details before the due date (27th of May 2019).
- 2. The abstracts, materials submitted in alignment to the PM Fair theme and relevance to the profession, feasibility of proposed activity, experience of the speaker will be reviewed and a list of selected presenters for the event will be decided.
- 3. Selected presenters will receive a confirmation letter with more specific information and deadline for the submission of their full draft presentation.
